FINANCIAL SUMMARY AUGUST, 2023

This month we had a net income of \$1,500, favorable to budget by \$645. Operating revenue was \$24,209, favorable to budget by \$3,408. This month included contributions from 3 individuals totaling \$9,769.

Operating expenses were \$22,709, unfavorable to budget by (\$2,403). August expenses included \$1,000 for our 5 year audit, \$2,730 for shrub trimming and maintenance and \$1,125 for our annual heating and HVAC maintenance contract.

The Building and Ministry Expansion Fund is \$196,767. This reflects the regular increase of \$991.

There were no other revenue or expense items that were not normal budget activity.

<u>PROPOSED</u> <u>REVISIONS TO</u> <u>THE CHURCH BY-</u> <u>LAWS</u>

ARTICLE IV - CHURCH COUNCIL ORGANIZATION

C. Members of the Council, except for the Pastor, shall be elected to a three (3) term. A Council member cannot serve two consecutive three year terms but would be eligible to serve again after a one year absence. Two members of the same immediate family (spouse, parents, siblings) may not serve on the Church Council at the same time. One third (1/3) of the Council members will be elected each year.

ARTICLE VI - CHURCH COUNCIL DUTIES

R. The Church Council shall appoint a Nominating Committee, consisting of two Council members and two members at large from the congregation.

The Nominating Committee will prepare a minimum list of four (4) candidates whenever possible for election to the Council for the next calendar year. The candidate list will be shared with the Council no later than the September Council Meeting. A short biography and photo of each candidate will be placed in the Church Bulletin for review. At the October Congregational Meeting, along Candidates with nominations from the floor, will be presented to the congregation for selection by majority vote via ballot. Ballots will be tabulated, and results reported to the Congregation.

ARTICLE IX PASTOR

B. The Pastor shall be the spiritual guide of the congregation. It shall be the duty of the Pastor to preach the Gospel, administer the

Sacraments participate in the work of Christian Education and perform such other duties as generally belong to the Pastor's office in the United Church of Christ, including but not limited to hospital visits and contacting shutins. Unless otherwise specified, the relationship between Pastor and congregation shall be based on the UCC Manual on Ministry. The Pastor shall keep a record of all services performed and provide the Church Council a monthly report, and an annual report to the Congregation.
